Edana Mac Brenna

Clan: Daeva

Covenant: Circle of the Crone

Believed Age: Appears to be in her late twenties and is rumored to be over 1,000 years old

Childer: Kaelan Mac Brenna, Owen Mac Brenna, and Cassidy Mac Brenna

Positions Held: Primogen of Southeast Nashville

What Others Will Know:

The outsider to Nashville would know:

Edana is the spiritual leader of the Mac Brenna family, and considers herself to be a priestess for an ancient pagan goddess who is called "the Morrigan." She claims to be a druid, and heads the Nashville Circle of Crone covenant.

The Mac Brenna are a tight-knit family that arrived in the United States from Ireland in the mid 1800s. Their goddess, the Morrigan is commonly believed to be "a Goddess of battles who appears in the form of a scavenging scald-crow or a ragged winged raven, glorying in death and battle." In emulating their goddess, the Mac Brenna are often warriors and priests.

The casual visitor would know:

While publicly she defers to her sire Caedmon, some wonder whether the Mac Brenna patriarch is still in possession of all his senses. There is little question as to why Edana was chosen as Primogen rather than Caedmon, as the revered founder of the Mac Brenna family is often scattered and lacks an understanding of modern life. By unspoken agreement, the entire family takes turns keeping a loving eye on Caedmon.

By contrast, Edana is quite grounded and capable. Of course, she is quick to point out that she is younger than Caedmon, hinting that his last torpor may have knocked some of his wits loose.

She appears to be quite committed to maintaining the stability of Nashville and her territory. All Kindred know that the Mac Brenna watch over some of the mortals in their territory, and do not take kindly to the intrusion of others. They do not seek conflict, but will gladly finish the fights that other people start. The family is known for being a little unruly, but when approached in the spirit of good fun, the Mac Brenna are likely to give you a good-natured slap on the back and invite you to join them.

Edana is quick to smile, and does not seem pressured to convert other kindred to her beliefs. Yet, if one should ever want more information, it is clear



that Edana is willing to speak any true seeker. She often speaks of the importance of personal freedom and choice, as well as honor and truth.

Nashville residents would know:

As are many Daeva, Edana can be fiery and sometimes moody. On some occasions she appears to have difficulty taking anything seriously, and had a tendency to laugh at everything and flirt outrageously. Other times she appears haunted and quiet, as if the weight of her life and choices makes it difficult for her to move or speak. But usually she is somewhere in between these extremes, friendly and easy-going.

But when her family is threatened, she can become rage incarnate. She protects her family with the devotion of a mother-wolf to her cubs. Edana acts very much as a mother toward her family, and is known to be impatient when business takes her time away from them.

The Mac Brenna message to Nashville is clear: *Do not attempt to harm what is ours and we will live and let live in peace.* ☺
